## **CONTEMPORARY COOL**

Defining the contemporary look, Selma Zaifoglu of Linear Concepts says: "Contemporary kitchens are the epitome of sophisticated, minimalist layouts. They're characterised by wooden elements and fresh countertops together with modern glass display focal points, and integrated appliances with a seamless design. This style is functional yet artistic in nature."

Elaborating on the ideal minimalist contemporary kitchen, Zaifoglu says: "The appearance should be clean but filled with luxe stone, sleek appliances and gorgeous finishes. A gravity-defying island always feels clean, modern and minimalistic. Using invisible hardware creates a streamlined look. Exposed hardware can be distracting or overwhelming."

## **DESIGN DETAILS**

A true minimalist kitchen has a timeless feel, as it's not defined by trends but rather design elements and materials that have a long-term appeal, says the nuuma design team.

"We focus on timeless design, and use materials ranging from matt or gloss finishes to natural stone and concrete, which are part of our sleek look, as well as introducing accent elements of bronze or smoked mirror or glass. Timber is also an important part of our palette – it offers character to the overall space."

On design, they say the less-is-more approach is key. "It's not so much about adding more but rather considering what can be taken away. >

A minimalist contemporary kitchen must respect aesthetics and functionality, says
Anthea Adam of Diva Cucine
Johannesburg. "One needs to draw on a collection rich in customising elements, which can allow designers to create a unique composition.

"Colours and materials are important, but above all modularity, appliances and accessories can enrich the offer. For these reasons minimalist contemporary kitchens must correspond to those who use it, where the different areas related to preparation, washing, storage and meals are extremely important."

## CABINETRY AND COUNTERTOPS

When it comes to cabinetry, sleek and simple designs are what make minimalist contemporary kitchens stand out.

On achieving this, Katlego Mabusela of FABRI South Africa says, "By applying a clever use of symmetry in the kitchen with horizontal and vertical lines, a sleek aesthetic can be realised.

Smooth and soft touches for cabinetry doors, and thin stone countertops of 12mm – 20mm thickness, complement the aesthetic well."

On colour, which is one of the most defining elements, Melanie Stein of Eurocasa says light-coloured kitchens in white and greys are currently the most popular shades, with wooden elements.

"However, having said that, we design some phenomenal dark kitchens. Depending on the personality of the client, we may use something bold to add a distinct accent. Of course, our offering consists of many different colours – we have many different cabinetry offerings of various shapes and colours.

"Even if light colours are the most used, for rich solutions we also offer many dark colours and warm materials that recall precious metals, adding elegance and a modernity that's timeless."
